Some years ago, we learned about the work of educationalist Howard Gardener, developmental a 'Theory psychologist known for this of Multiple Intelligences.' Gardner identified eight intelligences: linguistic (word smart); logic-mathematical (number smart); musical (music smart); spatial, bodily/kinesthetic (body and Practically smart); interpersonal (people smart); intrapersonal (self-smart) and naturalistic (nature smart). This theory allowed for the idea that there is more than one way to define a person's intellect, a liberating and empowering concept for us all. Over the last week, we have been revisiting the smart areas, through our game of 'pass the challenge' so that both the Old Gang and New are (re)acquainted with them. # Blackberry Ice Lollies

Prep: 20 mins | Makes 6 lollies

What you need

- Two handfuls of blackberries
- 1 cup of apple juice
- 1 teaspoon of honey
- Ice lolly moulds (or empty yoghurt pots and lolly sticks)

Keep your eyes peeled for juicy, ripe berries between August and October. Pick enough for your lollies, but leave enough for birds and other animals.

- 1. Wash the berries then mash them up in a bowl (or blitz them in a blender if you've got one).
- 2. Add the apple juice and honey to your blackberry mush and stir well.
- 3. Pour the mixture through a sieve to get rid of any pips.
- 4. Stir it again, then pour it into the lolly moulds (or yoghurt pots remember to add lolly sticks!)

Put them in the freezer and enjoy.
