Going for Gold!

The main focus of our week will be the trip to Withymead Nature reserve which has one of the largest collections of Loddon Lilies in Europe. The nature reserve is also home to a wealth of wildlife including otters, foxes and birds. We will learn how to make a bug hotel and hedgehog home as well as helping out with some small conservation projects.

In mathematics this week, The Houses will continue to learn how to find the area and perimeter of a given object. They will continue to work on their times tables (up to 5x) in random order. The Trees will consolidate their number work.

Following our visit to the Nature Reserve, the children will be writing up their nature notes using a range of sentence starters and a wide range of interesting and relevant vocabulary.

In PE, the children will develop their skipping routine for our sports' night and continue to learn how to play Tennis. They will need their scooters and helmets on Wednesday.

We are doing really well with our new star target (using our time well). Please reinforce this at home if you get the opportunity.

- Help your child to learn their times tables up to 5x so that they know them instantly.
- Read with and to your child on a regular basis.
