Leading the way in Learning

The children were asked to think about what they wanted to get out of our visit to Wheatley Birds of Prey Centre before we went. Alice wrote:

'I am going to challenge myself to hold at least one bird on my arm because I have had a fear of big birds for a long time.'

After the visit she reflected:

'Wheatley Birds of Prey was a great treat, especially holding the barn owl and watching the Harris hawk tempted by a little piece of chicken, swoop at full speed, and land on my arm. The European eagle owl was magnificent, broad and camouflaged. My personal challenge was to hold at least one bird of prey but I held two!'

This small vignette captures for me so well what The Treehouse is all about. Getting the children to the stage where they can set and conquer their own learning challenges is highly sophisticated and well, just awesome!
