My research has revealed that there is some overlap between our approach and the Finnish system, in particular, our shared desire for children's happiness to take priority. So, as we look forward to a new school year and the opportunities and challenges that it brings, we will bear that in mind ensuring that The Gang enjoy their time in school.

Keeping you in the Loop

After some time for reflection, our inspection and the accompanying report provided a valuable 'snapshot' of our practice. As well as endorsing certain areas of our work, the inspector, Ann Henderson who has a reputation for rigor, identified key areas for development, which we agree with and had been considering for some time.

We were thrilled with the comments and observations made about the children's attitudes and enthusiasm for learning, and that they enjoy school and feel safe when they are with us. Our challenge now is to strengthen some areas of our practice, such as providing the children with more regular opportunities to write at length and to practise and apply their math's skills, whilst maintaining a broad and balanced curriculum. One of the ways you can help is to support your child with their reading, writing and maths skills at home. We use the analogy of some of the very best athletes like Mo Farrah to remind the children that regular practise and hard work pays off. Furthermore, we aim for the children to take responsibility for this area of their learning, especially the older children, which will also help them when they move on.

Helping Your Child at Home...

Reading with Relish

We are so fortunate that all members of The Gang enjoy reading and listening to stories, regardless of their age, gender or reading ability. Hopefully, you are already aware that just before the summer holidays, each child brought a new reading journal home. In a bid to develop further the children's enthusiasm for reading, and of course their increasing ability to read and write with more independence, we decided to introduce a reading journal. The journal can be used to record responses to a range of reading material that your child has read with a member of the family or independently. Pictures, comments, clippings, extracts, notes, character descriptions...the list is endless... The journal should be kept in the child's 'Toughie' and brought to school every day. Please encourage your child to use their journal on a regular basis so that we can see what they are reading and enjoying at home as well as at school.

At The Gang's request, the Autumn term will kick off with a focus on the Second World War. If you have any books, artefacts or know of anybody who would be willing to talk to the children about their experiences we would love to hear from you.

Tables Practise

Former members of The Gang tell us that one of the most important and useful things they learned while they were with us, was their times tables. The best method for this is regular practise, using a set of playing cards, until the tables are secure. Please help your child to establish a regular practise time, daily if possible, for a few minutes. They will soon see the results...

Three for One!

We capitalise on the strong link between spelling, handwriting and reading during one of our weekly 'Going for Gold' sessions at The Treehouse by teaching children common sounds and rules. Over the last year, we have been impressed with the quality of the work that the children have produced at home. Whilst we recognise that finding the time to support your child with this can be a challenge, and in some cases, motivating your child to undertake 'extra' work at home, we would like to thank you for your support with this. The children will continue to bring their books home on a Wednesday and should hand them in on a Tuesday.
